

Brief History of The Nigerian Institute of Building



The Nigerian Institute of Building (NIOB) has its origin in a parent body called the Builders' Society, which was founded in 1834 by a number of prominent Builders in London. This body was renamed the Institute of Builders in 1884. Then in 1965, the name was changed to Institute of Building IOB. As the organisation gained royal charter, it was renamed "The Chartered Institute of Building" (CIOB) in 1980.

The Institute of Building Nigeria Centre was formed by the IOB Nigerian members, who had returned home after studying Building in the United Kingdom.

This overseas centre of the London-based Institute of Building was officially inaugurated on Friday, 31st March, 1967 at the Auditorium of the Advanced Teachers Training College, University of Lagos, Akoka, Yaba, Lagos. The event was chaired by a distinguished guest, Sir Mobolaji Bank-Anthony, KBE, FRSA, F. INST. D.

The Institute of Building Nigeria Centre, therefore, became the first overseas centre of the Institute of Building, London.

The first Chairman of the IOB Nigeria Centre (by the election held on 26th March, 1967) was Mr. Simeon Oladiran Okikiolu. He was succeeded through election in 1968 by Mr. Fatai Isola Osikoya. The IOB Nigeria Centre sought for autonomy in 1969 and it was granted by Institute of Building in London. Hence, the Nigerian Institute of Building (NIOB) was established in 1969.

• To promote and stimulate the improvement of the technical and general knowledge of persons to be engaged in the Building profession.



COUNCIL OF REGISTERED BUILDERS OF NIGERIA (CORBON).

It was established by Act CAP B13LFN, 2004 (formerly known as Decree No 45 of 1989). CORBON was established to regulate and control the practice of building profession in all its aspects and ramifications.

WHO IS A REGISTERED BUILDER?

A registered Builder is a person who has received an approved standard of professional training and practice in building and found competent after due examination and his/her name is entered into the register of the Council.

TRAINING

At present, there are twenty five (25) Universities offering B.Sc Building Programme and fifty six (56) Polytechnics offering Natonal(ND) or / and Higher Natonal Diploma (HND) Building Programmes in Nigeria. A graduate of Building Programmes would have undergone pupilage period under the supervision of a fully registered builder and passed the appropriate examinations of the Nigerian Insttute of Building (NIOB) and the interview of the Council of Registered Builders of Nigeria (CORBON), before attaining full professional status.

- 1. Construction programme .
- 2. Construction methodology.

he Primary Objective of Builders' Day is to create awareness on the need for stakeholders on building projects to adhere strictly to standards, codes of practice and building regulations.

Professionalism in building construction is the first step to reducing chances of substandard building construction practices, exercising risk mitigation, thereby promoting safety in the built environment.

Builders as the professionals saddled with the responsibility of managing building production on site must be technically sound to ensure that the architectural, structural, mechanical and electrical designs are wholesomely integrated to form a massive product composed of various elements, parts that will work in unison and sustainable.

Why March 13 for Builders' Day?

day of grievous fatality caused by building collapse was thought most appropriate for Builders' Day in order to arouse the conscience of participants in building projects on the consequences of defective construction work.

On the 13th March, 2019, a five-storey building collapsed at No 63, Massey Street, Ita- Faaji, Lagos Island, leading to the death of 20 occupants, including pupils while many others sustained injury. The building was a residential one that was partly converted to a primary school. Quackery, inadequate building regulations and monitoring challenges were major causes of the March 13 calamity.

The out-come of investigations on this Ita-Faaji building collapse coupled with the several previous building collapse cases in Lagos state made the government stipulate in the new Building Regulations of 2019 that building construction sites across Lagos State be managed by Registered Builders.

This is a Landmark regulation aimed at curbing incessant building collapse, which majorly was due to lack of expertise in the management of building production on site.

Invariably, Builders' Day 2021 is to echoe the need for other states of the federation to emulate the 2019 result-oriented Building Regulations of Lagos State.

The need to raise the low lifespan of the Nigerian buildings cannot be overemphasized.

onstruction of buildings to standard in Nigeria is our demand from the government. Frequent building failure in a nation due, majorly, to quackery is an abnormality that should not be allowed to continue in a sane society where the rule of law prevails.

As far back as (circa) 1754 BC, the 6th King of Babylon, Hammurabi recognised the need to protect building occupants by including in the Law, Building Codes 228 to 233 that proclaimed various punishments for inadequate building construction. Therefore, anybody who does not possess the required training in building construction and by misrepresentation got engaged in the building production process; such a person should be ready to face the consequences of quackery in a failed building project. Building production is a complex process that requires expertise in order to achieve serviceability and safety at reasonable cost. To forestall poor production of buildings on sites, Nigerian Government took some proactive measures by enacting into law the Builders' Act through Decree 45 of 1989, now CAP 13 LFN 2004.

The essence of the Act is to ensure that trained and licensed builders' solely manage production of buildings on sites in order to ascertain quality output.

To ensure that adequate trainings are provided for the would-be professional builders, the government approved the establishment of Building Departments in 25 universities and 56 polytechnics in Nigeria.

Intensive training in Building Technology involves knowledge acquisition in various aspects of building, spanning from Foundation to Roofing. Importantly, the government should be reminded of the fundamental relevance of building to its citizenry. Out of the three basic needs of man, that is, food, clothing and shelter, shelter or building is the one that can stand the test of time. Building is the most durable and, hence, it is cherished by the citizens as the bequest for the unborn.

In recognition of the importance of buildings, housing scheme takes a prominent position in the programmes of most governments. Construction of buildings is the barometer of a thriving economy. What distinguishes a city from a town, and a town from a village is the number and quality of buildings.

With the aspiration most Nigerians nurse to have their own buildings, the Nigerian Government should assist them to ensure that they do not fall victims of the preying quacks, the impostors that are currently superintending where they lack competence and thereby turning shelter into grave.

The incident on 13th of March, 2020 witnessed a climax of condemnation of the Nigerian Government across the world over what was termed its tolerance on incompetence and compromise on due diligence in its housing sector, making building collapse an unending phenomenon.

Premature death of pupils in a building that was constructed by quacks (developers), and had been showing visible signs of distress revealed a negligence that could not be excused by the government.

As we commiserate with the bereaved families on the anniversary of the demise of their kids, Professional Builders in Nigeria under the auspices of the Nigerian Institute of Building have earmarked 13th March as the annual sober reflection on and reminder of the evil being perpetrated by quacks in the Nigerian building construction industry. Yet there are several substandard and distressed buildings which were constructed by quacks on the Lagos Island and other parts of the country that are waiting to collapse.

From the fear of building collapse emerges the hope of a result-oriented building control that will correct the mistakes of the past and prevent further construction of substandard buildings.

Today, is the maiden Builders' Day in Nigeria. It is D-day for the promotion of standard building construction that should a d d value to the dream of prospective homeowners. It is a day for well meaning Nigerians to all say NO TO BUILDING COLLAPSE.

Certain periods during their academic training, students of Building undergo SIWES under the Industrial Training Fund (ITF) scheme to acquire practical knowledge on building sites.

At the inception of the one-year mandatory National Youth Service Corps (NYSC), many building graduates are usually posted to construction companies to initiate them into full time building production management.

After the NYSC, the building graduates proceed to professional cadres for various stages of examinations and mentoring in the Nigerian Institute of Building.

Once their competence has been ascertained with the Performance Index while working on building sites and gaining required experience, the corporate members of the NIOB undergo stringent interview with the government regulatory body, Council of Registered Builders' of Nigeria (CORBON).

Those who succeed in this practical-oriented interview become Registered Builders that

are licensed by CORBON to manage building production on sites.

At this juncture, the pertinent question to ask is: With the aforementioned appropriate and commendable system that the Nigerian Government has put in place to ensure professionalism in the production of buildings in Nigeria, why is the nation still plagued with the sordid crisis of building collapse that continues to injure and kill innocent people to the detriment of national development and Nigerian international image?

The stark reality is that production of buildings that have been collapsing was not managed by registered Professional builders. With this discovery, the solution to building collapse is not far fetched.

Absolutely without doubt, the Nigerian Government was proactive by taking preemptive measures, installing a system that has been producing Professional Builders. However, the second phase that should complement the initial proactiveness of the government is the institutionalization of a mechanism that will ensure that building production on sites is managed by the Professional Builder.

This simple approach that has just been adopted by the Lagos State Government in its new Building Regulations of 2019 should be emulated across Nigeria with commitment and enforcement in line with global best practices. The penalty stipulated in the regulation for those that flout the antiquackery rule should not be compromised in order to uphold the doctrine of inevitable consequence, that is our prayer and it is legitimate.

Again, Professional Builders' must take their rightful place as the managers of the building production and construction processes in all building projects in Nigeria. This is an irreducible minimum to promote sanity in project development and for the overall good of our society.

Our nation needs not continue to waste lives and property while it has a stock of specialists with the appropriate body of knowledge for the construction of lasting and sustainable buildings.

Financial investment in building is huge. Owners of buildings are required to do due diligence, and are also entitled to safe buildings in addition to value for money. Building collapses cast a dent and a slur on our national image. We are here to stop the embarrassment. We enjoin all public spirited individuals and organisations to join in this campaign. Do your part, build right, use the right professional for building construction, engage and support professional builders.

Stakeholders in the building industry should promote the discipline where the right person does what he or she is trained for.

From manufacturers of building materials to Building Artisans and Professionals, the culture of doing it right must be embraced at the Builders' Day being held in all states of the Federation and the federal Capital Territory.

Any nation bereft of building codes is vulnerable to inappropriate building construction. Stakeholders in the Nigerian Built Environment have, for long, been orchestrating the need for building construction in Nigeria to be guided by the National Building Code.

The Minister of Works and Housing, Mr. Babatunde Fashola, SAN is enjoined not to relent in his efforts at overcoming the stumbling blocks that have been delaying the use of the National Building Code in Nigeria.

The Executive, Legislative and Judiciary arms of Nigeria and state governments should endeavour, without further delay, to make the National Building Code operational in every locality of the federation.


